The General Education component of the Northland Pioneer College Associate of Science degree fulfills the Arizona General Education Curriculum (AGEC-S). The AGEC-S, when completed, will transfer to the three public Arizona state universities as a block, meeting all lower division general education requirements. If the AGEC-S block is not completed, courses will be articulated at the universities on a course-by-course basis and may not meet the specific general education requirements at the university. **The AGEC-S is NOT a degree.** Students must complete 28 additional elective credits.
