Whiteriver Center display honors Apache veterans

A Roll Call parchment at NPC's Whiteriver Center is honoring Apache men and women military veterans or active duty who have died, have served or are serving to preserve our rights.

"The 'Roll Call' parchment has become extremely popular around here," commented A.J. Taylor, Whiteriver Center manager. "There are folks who stand at it like at 'The Wall' in Washington (D.C.) and search for names. The display serves two purposes – to honor those Apache who have served, and to remind students of the freedoms provided by their fellow Apache."

Students and community members can submit names to be included on the display, which, in some cases, includes the servicemember's branch of the armed forces. An American flag stands beside the display, which will soon be joined by a new Veterans Benefit Bulletin Board. Center assistant Fernanda Alekay enters the names onto the parchment.
