

# Apply by Feb. 6 for NPC 40th Anniversary Scholarships

Employee donations and successful fund-raising events collected \$34,615 for Northland Pioneer College's 40th Anniversary Scholarship Fund.

Now, the **NPC Friends and Family Alliance** is accepting applications from degree-seeking NPC students for full scholarships of up to \$1,500 per semester to cover the actual costs of tuition, fees and textbooks. *The scholarship is intended for students with a financial need who are not federal Pell Grant eligible.*

To apply, a student must be enrolled in at least one class during the spring 2015 semester, with no limit on the number of credit hours. Other requirements are

a high school diploma or GED, a 2.5 or better grade-point-average and a degree contract on file with NPC's academic advisers.

**Deadline for applying is Feb. 6, 2015.** Applicants must submit a letter of interest describing how the scholarship will help you reach your educational goals and a copy of your spring 2015 class schedule. You must also complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), available online at [fafsa.ed.gov](http://fafsa.ed.gov), and an NPC Financial Aid Information Form.
