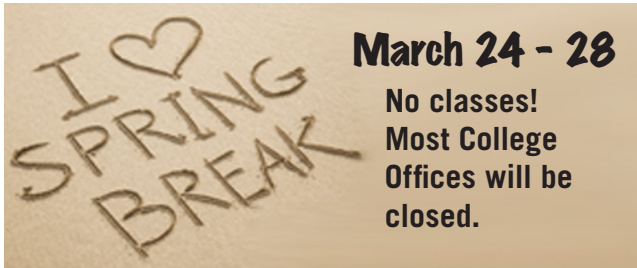

Leadership Lecture Series features Cholla Plant's Edward Seal, April 9

Open to current students, alumni and interested community members, NPC's Leadership Lecture Series continues its spring series with Cholla Power Plant Manager **Edward Seal** on Wednesday, **April 9**, 6 to 7:30 p.m., at the Tiponi Community Center at PDC. NPC's Student Government Association and Career Services are partnering to host the Leadership Lecture Series. The program will feature career and industry guest speakers from a variety of backgrounds and occupations. These leaders will share personal stories and insights on achieving success and the path they took to get to where they are today.

Seal retired from the U.S. Navy in May, 2013, after 30 years in the submarine service. He commanded two nuclear-powered submarines, as well as a surface ship responsible for maintenance and repair of submarines.

As Cholla Plant Manager, he is responsible for overseeing all facets of generation, operations and maintenance and deals with numerous federal and state regulatory agencies.
