

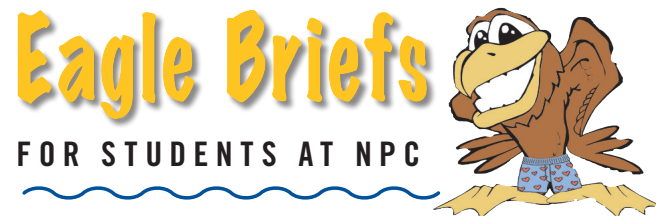
Frontier challenge grant could add \$5,000 for student scholarships
