

Register for Fall Semester Classes Starting April 28

The schedule of fall classes will be viewable online starting April 14. Avoid the rush and schedule an appointment now with your academic adviser. Then you'll be ready to enroll online through **MyNPC**, starting **April 28**.

If you're waiting for your tax refund to pay your tuition, you can enroll, then defer payment – for dates visit www.npc.edu/payment-due-dates – or consider the eCashier Payment Plan option. *Be sure to pay by the due date or you'll lose your seat in class.* Financial aid awards are expected to be distributed to students July 31.

There are several important changes starting this fall. Base in-state tuition increases to **\$66** per credit hour.

The Media Fee for students taking 3 or more credits increases to **\$40** per semester.

Non-students wanting to use NPC computers or wireless Internet access will also be charged a **\$40** per semester fee.

You must now meet with your academic adviser and declare a degree intention if you have earned **12** or more credits (instead of the previous 32 credits). And be sure to sign up for a free **Student Orientation, Advising, Registration (SOAR)** session, www.npc.edu/SOAR, if you have not done so already.

A new **Finish Line** scholarship is available to help students complete the final 12 credits needed for a degree. You must demonstrate financial need, by com-

pleting a **2014-15 PELL** grant application, fafsa.ed.gov. Academic advisers will have the necessary application forms and can explain the process.
