NPC, in partnership with local law enforcement agencies in Navajo and Apache counties, is creating the **Northeastern Arizona Law Enforcement Academy (NALETA)**, with the first class scheduled to begin Aug. 2 at the Jake Flake Emergency Services Institute (Northeast Arizona Training Center).

NALETA will be a fully certified, 10-month, 585-

hour Arizona Peace Officer Standards and Training (AzPOST) "closed" academy, meaning students must be "sponsored" by a law enforcement agency. The sponsorship process usually takes four to eight weeks
