



raises \$27,201 for NPC scholarships

of NPC Friends and Family, at the conclusion of **Arizona Gives Day** on Tuesday, April 5. The nonprofit alliance received \$22,201 in donations plus a \$5,000 bonus from Arizona Gives Day corporate sponsor 1st Bank to help support NPC student scholarships.

"We raised \$7,967 more than our initial participation last year, with 117 donors, many of them new, qualifying Friends and Family for the additional \$5,000

bonus, above what was donated," continued Wilson. "My Board President **Eric Bishop** made two last-minute, ace-up-the-sleeve gives to hold us in fourth place making us eligible for the \$5,000 bonus."
