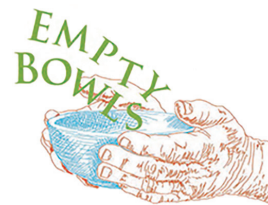

Arizona Ready for College and Career AmeriCorps

Arizona Ready for College and Career is recruiting for 35 Full-Time and 30 Part-Time positions to serve at different locations throughout Arizona.

Through this project CSI@NAU will place 65 AmeriCorps members who will prepare students for on-time high school graduation and college enrollment in low-income communities and Title 1 schools in Arizona whose on-time high school graduation rates are lower than the national average of 81.4%.

AmeriCorps members will receive training in college access from the Arizona College Access Network and Northern Arizona University. Applications will be accepted on a rolling basis with positions starting Sept. 20, Sept. 27, Oct. 4, mid-January, and early March.
