## Direct Care Worker class begins Oct. 13

If you are providing assistance with daily living activities to older adults or individuals with disabilities, completing a new eight-week **Direct Care Worker (DCW)** course at the Show Low campus qualifies you to receive financial compensation when providing services to clients under the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS).

Register during regular business hours for the DCW course, **Oct. 13** through **Dec. 5** (HES 199-94257). Classes meet in the Ponderosa Center, room 103, on Tuesdays and Thursdays, from 3:30 to 6:30 p.m., with a hands-on lab section meeting on Wednesdays and Fridays from 4 until 6:45 p.m.
