Applications due Nov. 4 for All-AZ Academic Team

Members of the **All-Arizona Academic Team** receive Board of Regents tuition waivers for up to 60 credits, **worth over \$30,000**, to complete their bachelor's degree at one of the three Arizona public universities.

You could be one of the 18 NPC students (2 per campus or center) to receive this academic honor, but you must complete the online application by **November 4**.

[NPC deadline date was changed to allow time to correct, improve applications.]

You must have a GPA of 3.5 or better and be on track to complete your associate or bachelor's degree. Involvement in community or college activities, such as student government, tutoring or assisting in hunger relief, is considered in the selection process.
