A dinner theatre performance will be at 6 p.m. on **Thursday, November 15**. **November 10 is already SOLD OUT.** Reservations for the three-course catered meal are **\$25**, with no refunds or discounts available. The main entrée is a sausage and pork cassoulet. A gluten-free vegetarian cassoulet option is available. Seating is limited to 52 couples or 104 patrons per performance.

Show-only performances will be at 7 p.m. on **Friday, November 9** and **16**, and **Saturday, November 17**. There will also be a 2 p.m. Saturday matinee. Advance tickets are **\$7**; day of performance, **\$9**. Senior citizens, those 60+, NPC students and staff receive a \$1 discount to show-only performances.
