Registration for spring semester classes at NPC opens at 7:30 a.m. on Monday, Nov. 26, for both new and returning students. A schedule of classes will be available for viewing online on Nov. 13.

To avoid long lines, returning students are encouraged to use **MyNPC** to enroll in classes. Computers are available in advising areas and campus/center offices for students to use to register.

If you have earned 12 or less credits, you must complete a **Student Orientation, Advising, Registration (SOAR)** session before you can register for classes.

Students who have applied for financial aid can check the status of their application by logging in to their **MyNPC** account, or by calling the Financial Aid Office, (800) 266-7845, ext. 7318.

Individuals seeking admission to NPC's Associate Degree Nursing Program must successfully complete the Health Education Systems, Inc. (HESI) Admission Assessment. Testing is done in the spring to allow for applications to the program prior to the Feb. 15, 2013 deadline. Appointments for the exam will be accepted starting Nov. 28.
