NPC's Student Government Association (SGA) is awarding five scholarships for students to study Spanish for four weeks this summer at the University of Costa Rica.

Scholarship applications, available at campus or center offices, are due by **MARCH 27**. Students will earn six credits while attending weekday classes for four weeks, **JUNE 28 TO JULY 30**. The cost for tuition, room and 2 meals per day is \$1,985, plus an estimated \$500 for airfare. The Study Abroad program is not restricted to scholarship applicants.
