## Access Your Grades Online

The Records & Registration Office will no longer be mailing grade reports to students.

Access your grades by logging on to **MyNPC** from your personal or NPC library or lab computer. Just click on the **MYNPC** button on NPC's website, [www.NPC.edu](http://www.NPC.edu).

Students needing a printed copy of their grades must make a special request using a *Final Grades Request Form*. It will take approximately 4–5 business days to process the request **AFTER** all grades have been submitted. There is no charge.
