Jack Kent Cooke Foundation offers scholarships for cc transfer students

Current NPC students and recent alumni planning to pursue four-year degrees at an accredited college or university could receive up to \$30,000 annually to meet educational expenses.

Through the Undergraduate Transfer Scholarship Program, the JACK KENT COOKE FOUNDATION can provide funding for tuition, room and board, required fees, and books for the length of the undergraduate degree process, generally two years. The program is open to current community college students and alumni, who earned a degree since spring 2006 and have not yet transferred to a four-year college.
