

Spring semester registration begins Nov. 28

Registration for spring semester classes at Northland Pioneer College opens at 7:30 a.m. on **Monday, Nov. 28**, at all campus and center locations, by phone and online. Spring classes begin the week of **Jan. 17**.

A schedule of classes is viewable online Nov. 14 at www.npc.edu. Printed copies will be mailed on Nov. 23.

By registering early, students can take advantage of **FREE** standard UPS shipping for **textbook orders**

placed between **Nov. 28** and **Dec. 4** from the online bookstore. NPC also allows early registration with the opportunity to delay payment until Dec. 16.

Students also avoid a \$25 Late Registration Fee by enrolling before Jan. 17.

Many classes fill rapidly, especially science prerequisites for admission to the college's nursing and allied health programs.
