Pharmacy technician courses added

Training for high-paying certified entry-level pharmacy technician careers will be offered this spring in Winslow (PHT 101-73196) on Tuesday and Wednesday, 7:30 to 9:29 p.m. and Snowflake/Taylor (PHT 101-73197) on Tuesday and Thursday, 6 to 8:59 p.m.

Individuals interested in becoming pharmacy technicians can have no prior felony convictions or record of drug or substance abuse. Students must be 18 or older, have a GED or high school diploma, obtain a Pharmacy Technician Training License (\$46) from the Arizona State Board of Pharmacy and acquire fingerprint clearance (\$65) from the Arizona Department of Public Safety to enroll in the six-credit course. Tuition is \$336 plus a \$40 course fee, \$35 media fee and textbooks (±\$225). Students must also have current CPR & First Aid (EMT 104 – \$38) certification.
