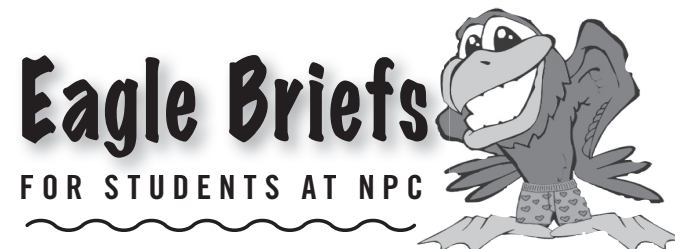
Information on the OLD website will still be available for a while at www.old.npc.edu.

To qualify for work-study, students must have completed a FASFA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) prior to January 2008.
