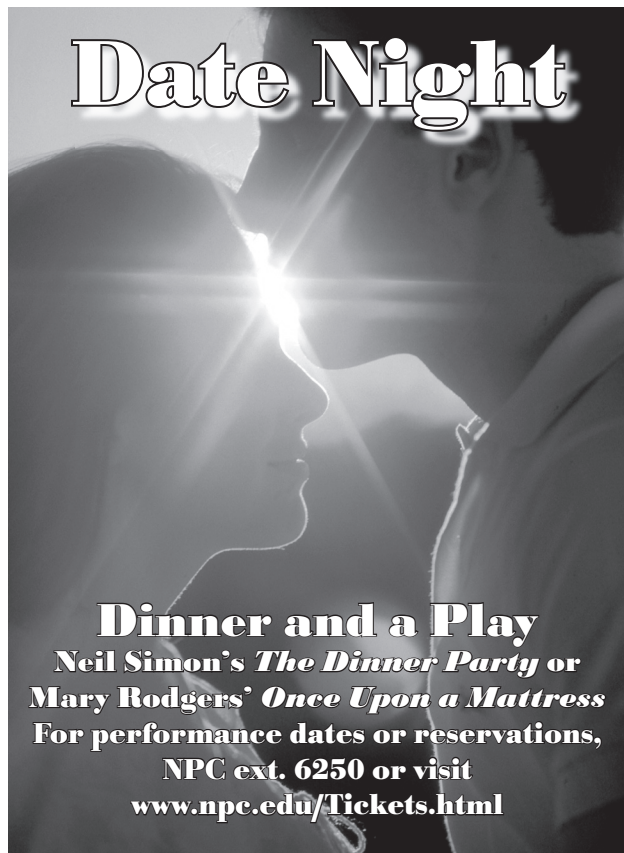

A Halloween-themed reception on Friday, Oct. 27, from 7 until 9 p.m. will open the newest exhibit at Northland Pioneer College's Talon Gallery in the Aspen Center on the Show Low - White Mountain Campus, 1001 W. Deuce of Clubs.

Between the Worlds: Alternative Art from the Void features visual arts by members and guests of Void Where Prohibited arts group - JoBeth Sexton, Justine Wintersmith, Lee Sweetman, Marcia Buckpitt, Karl Larson, Randy White, Patrick Connor, Jessi Jackson and Alexander Dorian Travis.

"The art will be expressive and may be disturbing, funny, serious and thought-provoking," explained Sweetman, who is chair of the NPC art department and gallery director. "It is a show designed to stimulate the viewer's own responses, rather than impose specific visions of reality. To that end, rational thought and use of conventional realism are rejected."

The show will open to the general public, Oct. 30 and run through Nov. 17. Gallery hours are 8 a.m. to 9 p.m., Monday through Thursday, and 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Fridays. The college will be closed on Friday, Nov. 10, in observance of Veterans' Day.
